LEAD FROM HOME

We want to come alongside you as you lead your child spiritually. If you'd like to follow along with the CVCKids' lesson plans, first familiarize yourself with the month's Bible Stories and Bottom Lines from the Parent Cue. Below are suggestions for how to teach your preschooler the new Bible story lesson each Sunday, followed by further ideas for continued learning throughout the rest of the week. Choose the items that appeal to you and your child. Don't feel pressured to do everything. Always remember that you are free to modify the material so that it works for your family. Most of all, enjoy this time of spiritual learning at home, and build habits that will last!

Lead your child in the weekly activity (on the back of this page).

Ideas For Continued Learning During The Week:

Read the Bible story.

Tell the Bible story in your own words.

Say the Bottom Line.

Learn the Memory Verse.

Review the Basic Truths.

Complete Raquel's corresponding activity (cvconline.org).

Do the suggested Parent Cue activities.

When real life collides with Bible story lessons, talk about it.

Sing and dance to the preschool playlist (cvconline.org).

Get creative and do what inspires you!

WEEK 1

In the evening, play a game with your child.

Turn the lamp off in the room.

Have your child jump up and say “light” when you turn on the lamp.

Have your child lie down and say “dark” when you turn off the lamp.

Do this several times.

Then, explain that God made light and called it day.

God called the dark night.

God made the light and God made everything!



WEEK 2

Lay a blanket down outside when there are white clouds in the sky.

Encourage your child to lie down next to you on the blanket.

Look at the sky and clouds together.

Talk about the shapes you see in the clouds.

Tell your child that God made the sky and the clouds.



WEEK 3

Gather items that fit in the categories of land and plants.

Some examples are rocks, dirt, leaves, flowers, vegetables, etc.

Place them in a bin or on your table.

Examine them together with your child.

Use a magnifying glass if you have one.

Talk about how God made the land and plants.



WEEK 4

List different activities and ask your child if the activities happen when the sun is shining or when the moon is shining.

Ideas are riding a bike, sleeping, putting on pajamas, playing, etc.

Tell your child that God created the sun, moon, and the stars.

We see the sun during the day and the moon and stars at night.



WEEK 5

Play the song “Winter Wonderland” while you pretend to waddle like penguins.

Play “Under the Sea” while you do a crab walk with your child.

Tell your child that God made all the birds, fish, and sea creatures.
