Ways to participate with orphan care and adoption:

- Pray for orphans and waiting children.
- Pray for the families who are adopting and fostering.
- Financially support ministries that help with adoption.
- Financially support an orphanage.
- Go on mission trips to orphanages.
- Serve in an adoption ministry like Bethany or Spirit of Faith (there are always opportunities to volunteer).
- Advocate and be vocal about orphan care.
- Find ways to use your vocation or skills. For example—lawyers and notaries—you can offer your services free or at great discounts to families that need your expertise.
- Physical support for families: meals, childcare, house sit if they go out of country, run errands, throw a baby shower, give diapers and formula, bring meals to families who just adopted, give them money (insurance doesn't cover adoption).
