

CVC Sunday Indoor Service Safety Guidelines



Our main goal as we resume indoor worship services is to provide a *clean* and *safe* environment that allows everyone to worship God and grow in their walk with Christ. Please know these safety guidelines are designed to accomplish our goal of a primarily no-touch and socially distanced experience, avoid confusion, offer transparency of our plans, and ensure safety of the people entrusted to us by God. These guidelines may be modified per recommendations by the state or federal government as well as the Center for Disease Control. General Guidelines: We encourage those who are medically unable to attend, those who do not feel safe or comfortable attending inside, those who are high-risk, unable to wear masks, or those with younger children to watch the service from home online.

Self-Screening Expectations: For everyone's safety, we are requiring each individual and family to complete a self-assessment prior to heading to CVC on Sunday. You'll need to stay home if you or anyone in your household is experiencing any symptoms related to COVID-19. Because this is a large indoor gathering of people, we want to take extra precautions. Even minor symptoms, which a lot of people may label as "allergies" (scratchy throat, mild cough and/or runny nose) could potentially be someone infected, so if you are experiencing those symptoms you should stay home and watch online. We ask that you do not attend a worship service indoors unless you have been symptom-free and fever-free (less than 100°) for at least 72 hours. Masks: Masks are required for everyone (ages 6 and up) at all times while inside the building. Disposable masks will be provided for those who don't have one. The only exceptions are the teaching pastor and worship team, who will not be required to wear a mask while they are on the platform, which is distanced from all attending the service. They will be required to wear a mask while they are not on the platform. Masks need to cover your nose, mouth, and chin. Masks and gaiters are acceptable face coverings, but face shields and bandanas are not.

Safe Distancing: Each venue will be set up specifically to ensure safe distancing, while keeping families (or people living in the same household) together. Every other row of seats has been removed. Please leave two (2) empty chairs between households/family units while seated. Please maintain six feet distance from other families/households at all times.

Traffic Flow: There will be one set of doors to ENTER the building and enter the worship center, and a separate set of doors to EXIT the worship center and building. The doors will be clearly marked. The front doors on the RIGHT side of the building will be ENTRANCE ONLY. The front doors on the LEFT side of the building will be EXIT ONLY. No entry from the back doors (doors locked from the outside at all times). These doors should only be used as emergency exits.

Touch-Free Environments: We are working diligently to provide primarily touch-free environments to prevent the spread of germs wherever possible. Offering baskets will not be passed. Instead, online giving is encouraged and offering boxes have been placed at several exits throughout the building. Response cards/prayer cards will only be available upon request at the Info Desk. We're also asking that you "air high five" instead of giving handshakes and hugs to others in the building. We love each other enough to keep a safe distance.
